synonym: wire, amaze, astonish

The product developed through years of research continues to **electrify** the market.

supple

adj. flexible and easy to bend or move; gracefully agile; adaptable or responsive to change or new ideas

synonym: flexible, pliable, bendable

(1) supple muscles, (2) supple leather

The ballerina's **supple** movements left the audience mesmerized.

refrigeration

n. the process of cooling or freezing something, especially food, to preserve it

synonym: cooling, freezing, preservation

(1) refrigeration car, (2) refrigeration technology

The supermarket had a large **refrigeration** section with all kinds of fresh produce.

emit

synonym: give off, radiate, expel

byproduct

 a secondary or incidental product produced in the manufacture or synthesis of something else

synonym: side effect, spinoff, outgrowth

The **byproduct** of the energy production process is a large amount of carbon dioxide emissions.

heroine

a woman admired or idealized for her courage,
 outstanding achievements, or noble qualities; a woman who is the protagonist of a literary work or film

synonym: protagonist

The brave **heroine** rescued the prince from the dragon's lair.

ascribe

- v. to attribute something to a particular cause or source synonym: attribute, credit, assign

equate

v. to consider or describe one thing as similar, equal, or analogous

synonym: associate, liken, relate

electrolysis

synthesize
