phylum

 a major group or category of animals or plants characterized by shared physical, developmental, and evolutionary characteristics

synonym: division, group, classification

hanger

 a device or object used for hanging or supporting something, often used for hanging clothes; a loop-shaped object used to hang clothes in a closet

synonym: hook, peg, rack

(1) clothes hanger, (2) coat hanger

I hung the coat on a **hanger** in the closet.

screwdriver

n. a tool used for turning screws, typically consisting of a handle and a metal rod with a flattened tip that fits into the slot on the head of a screw; a popular cocktail made with vodka and orange juice

synonym: screw, driver, wrench

(1) open the can with a **screwdriver**, (2) electric **screwdriver**

I need a flathead **screwdriver** to tighten the loose screws on this cabinet.

scraping

n. the act of removing a thin layer of material from a surface, often to clean or smooth it; a sound or sensation that is produced by something being removed or rubbed against another surface; (of computer technology) the automated extraction or collection of data from websites

synonym: abrading, scratching, rubbing

(1) scraping tools, (2) metal scraping

The **scraping** sound coming from the engine made us worry about the car's condition.

putty

 a soft, pliable substance, typically made of clay, plaster, or dough, used for filling cracks, sealing glass panes, or molding

synonym: paste, adhesive, cement

(1) putty work, (2) moldable putty

She used a putty knife to smooth out the surface of the wall.

paperweight

 a small, heavy object, often made of glass or metal, that is designed to hold down papers or other items on a desk or table; an object, usually an electronic device or piece of machinery, that is non-functional or useless for its intended purpose

synonym: desk weight, document holder

(1) metallic **paperweight**, (2) **paperweight** gift

The stained-glass **paperweight** added a pop of color to the desk.

deduce

 to arrive at an answer, a conclusion, or a decision by reasoning

synonym: conclude, infer, suppose

(1) **deduce** facts from the evidence, (2) **deduce** the meaning of a word

The researcher **deduced** the momentum of the particles from meteoritic velocities.

peel

- v. to remove the skin of fruit and vegetables synonym: pare, unclothe, disrobe
- (1) **peel** a fruit, (2) **peel** off easily

The storm had **peeled** all paint off the siding.

deduct

v. to take away an amount or part of the money, points, etc. from a total

synonym: remove, subtract, withdraw

(1) **deduct** the interest, (2) **deduct** \$100 from the price The bank **deducted** the premium amount from his bank account.

innovate

- v. to introduce new methods, ideas, or products synonym: bring in, introduce, found
- (1) **innovate** a new method, (2) **innovate** the quality of his life

Companies developing self-driving cars consistently **innovate** the emerging technologies.

Newtonian

adj. relating to Sir Isaac Newton or his laws of motion and universal gravitation synonym: classical, physics, mechanics

(1) **Newtonian** physics, (2) **Newtonian** mechanics

The motion of planets can be described using **Newtonian** mechanics.

clockwork

 a mechanism in which a series of gears, springs and other mechanical elements are used to power a device, especially a clock

synonym: mechanism, movement, gears

(1) run like **clockwork**, (2) **clockwork** precision

The **clockwork** mechanism in the grandfather clock needed to be wound up every week.

recombine

- v. to combine or put together again or differently; to cause genetic recombination (= the process by which genetic material is broken and joined to other genetic material)
- (1) **recombine** at the surface, (2) ability to **recombine**Some scientists argue that the genes in food should not be artificially **recombined**.

fiddle

v. to continuously touch or manipulate something with someone's hands, mainly when bored or nervous; to act dishonestly to try to get money, information, etc., or gain an advantage

synonym: tinker, diddle, play

(1) **fiddle** with a PC, (2) **fiddle** away the whole afternoon She was able to **fiddle** a free trip to the United States.

Australopithecus

 any of several extinct hominid species that lived in Africa between 4 million and 1 million years ago and are considered to be among the earliest ancestors of modern humans

synonym: hominid, primate, ape

(1) Australopithecus skull, (2) Australopithecus africanus Australopithecus fossils have been found in Eastern and Southern Africa.

flourish

- v. to grow or develop vigorously or successfully synonym: boom, advance, succeed
- (1) **flourish** economically, (2) **flourish** worldwide

The Ottoman Empire **flourished** for over five centuries.

flake

 a small, thin piece or layer of something, often with a flat or irregular shape; a person who is unreliable or inconsistent

synonym: chip, bit, shred

(1) flakes of snow, (2) flake graphite

She found a paint **flake** on the wall and realized it was time to repaint the room.

chariot

- a two-wheeled horse-drawn battle vehicle used in ancient Egypt, Greece, and Rome for warfare and racing
- (1) chariot builder, (2) chariot race

The ancient Romans enjoyed spectating **chariot** races.

writ

- n. a written legal order or commandsynonym: legal document, order, legal process

He was served with a **writ** of eviction, giving him the notice to vacate the property.

stylus

 a thin, pointed tool used to write, draw, or select items on a touchscreen device

synonym: pen, pointer, cursor

Many artists prefer to use a **stylus** over their fingers when drawing on a digital canvas.

crossbow

- a weapon consisting of a bow mounted on a stock that shoots projectiles, such as arrows, by pulling a trigger
 synonym: bow, arrow gun, slingshot
- (1) medieval **crossbow**, (2) **crossbow** bolts

The hunter aimed his **crossbow** at the deer in the forest.

n. a mathematical function that indicates the power to which a fixed number (the base) must be raised to produce another given number expressed as an exponent

synonym: mathematical function, exponent, power

(1) logarithm function, (2) logarithm table

To solve this equation, you must take both sides' logarithms.

Christ

synonym: Savior, Jesus Christ, Jesus
