opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

treasury

 n. the government department in charge of managing public funds; the funds of a government or institution or individual

synonym: coffer, exchequer, bank

(1) treasury bonds, (2) treasury money

The protracted war nearly depleted the country's **treasury**.

immerse

v. to become fully involved in a particular activity; to dip or submerge in a liquid, especially so that they or it are entirely covered

synonym: dip, inundate, submerge

He **immersed** himself in his research.

blockchain

- a system in which a growing list of payment records, called blocks, made in cryptocurrency is maintained across several computers that are securely linked
- (1) blockchain platform, (2) the scalability of blockchain

Cryptocurrencies are only one form of implementation of **blockchain** technology.

decentralize

v. to move the power, control, or authority of an organization, government, or system from a single place to several smaller ones

synonym: deconcentrate, disperse, distribute

We need to **decentralize** our data to recover quickly from a disaster.

iterate

 to repeat or do something again, often to make improvements or correct errors; to go over or revisit something repeatedly; to restate or emphasize a point or idea

synonym: repeat, reiterate, echo

We need to iterate on this design to improve its functionality.

goggle

serf

 a person in feudal society who is bound to work on a lord's land and owes allegiance to the lord; a person who is subjected to a tyrannical or oppressive authority

synonym: peasant, slave, servant

(1) **serf** labor, (2) medieval **serfs**

My history class discussed the **serf-based** economy that dominated Europe during the Middle Ages.

toil

v. to work hard and persistently; to engage in physically or mentally demanding tasks or activities for extended periods of time

synonym: struggle, labor, work hard

(1) **toil** to make a living, (2) **toil** up the mountain

The farmers **toiled** in the fields, harvesting the crops before the start of the rainy season.

accrue

v. (of a benefit or sum of money) to increase or accumulate in number or amount over a period of time

synonym: increase, accumulate, amass

Two-percent interest will accrue on your savings account.

covet

transact

partake

v. to participate or share in something; to consume or enjoy food or drink

ape

 a large animal with long arms, no tail, and usually a lot of body hair, including gorillas, chimpanzees, orangutans, and gibbons

synonym: monkey, primate, simian

uphold

 to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain
