synonym: develop, modernize, city-build

#### foresee

v. to perceive or predict; to anticipate or expect something to happen in the future

synonym: predict, anticipate, forecast

(1) **foresee** the consequences, (2) **foresee** challenges I **foresee** a problem arising if we don't address this issue now.

#### comrade

 a close associate, friend, or companion, especially one who shares one's interests, beliefs, or political convictions; a fellow member of an organization, especially a military or political group, who shares a common cause or objective

synonym: ally, friend, mate

(1) **comrade** in arms, (2) trusted **comrade**We worked together as **comrades** to finish the project on time.

# entropy

 a scientific concept that is most commonly associated with a state of disorder, randomness, or uncertainty

*synonym*: randomness

(1) **entropy** calculation, (2) **entropy** conservation Since the second law of thermodynamics is applicable to the universe, the **entropy** of the universe continues to increase.

# provocative

adj. arousing anger, interest, or another strong reaction, especially deliberately

synonym: instigating, provoking, inciting

(1) provocative questions, (2) a provocative smile

His **provocative** style frequently sparked controversies.

### quantifiable

adj. able to be measured, expressed, or quantified in numerical or statistical terms

synonym: measurable, calculable

(1) non- **quantifiable** risk, (2) **quantifiable** results

The impact of the new policy will be **quantifiable** through measurable data.

#### conceivable

adj. imaginable or possible to understand or believe in the mind

synonym: believable, imaginable, probable

(1) **conceivable** way, (2) **conceivable** emergency It is challenging to defend every **conceivable** target.

#### anthill

 a mound or hill made by a colony of ants, often as a nest or shelter, which can vary in size and shape depending on the species of ant and the surrounding environment

*synonym*: ant nest, ant mound, formicary

(1) anthill colony, (2) anthill on the trail

The ants were busy building an anthill in the garden.

#### mammal

- any animal of which the female gives birth to live young, not eggs, and feeds her young on milk from her own body
- (1) a primitive **mammal**, (2) a sort of **mammal**Marine **mammal** populations are declining worldwide due to ocean pollution.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

(1) a hard and **resilient** steel, (2) **resilient** population

She is a **resilient** person and has always bounced back from setbacks.

#### astonishing

adj. surprising or shocking; difficult to believesynonym: surprising, shocking, astounding

(1) **astonishing** achievement, (2) make **astonishing** gains The news of her sudden death was **astonishing** to everyone who knew her.

#### constrain

v. to restrict or limit someone or something's freedom or ability to do something

synonym: restrict, limit, confine

(1) **constrain** his freedom, (2) **constrain** information flow The political situation **constrained** the country's economic growth and foreign relations.

#### well-defined

adj. having clear and precise boundaries or characteristics;
 distinctly outlined or delimited; easily understood or recognizable

synonym: clear, distinct, precise

(1) **well-defined** terms, (2) **well-defined** objectives The **well-defined** set of instructions made it easy to assemble the furniture.

capita

 a Latin word meaning "head," used to express the amount for each person; any head or headlike expansion on a structure, as on a bone

synonym: head, headcount, person

(1) per **capita** sales, (2) the agricultural yield per **capita** GDP per **capita** shrunk by almost 10 percent for the third consecutive year.

# regularity

n. the quality or state of being done often; conformity to a set of rules, standards, or expectations; the state of occurring with a consistent or predictable pattern or frequency

synonym: consistency, uniformity, regularness

(1) the **regularity** of his breathing, (2) sleep **regularity**The **regularity** of exercise is important for maintaining good health.

#### intracellular

adj. existing or occurring within the cells of an organism or structure; situated or taking place within the boundaries of a cell

synonym: cellular, intracellularly

(1) **intracellular** compartment, (2) **intracellular** parasites The **intracellular** signaling pathways play a crucial role in cellular communication.

#### multicellular

adj. characterized by the presence of multiple or many cells, as opposed to unicellular (having only one cell)

synonym: multicelled, many-celled, complex

cells working together.

# circulatory

adj. relating to the system that moves blood through the body, which includes the heart, arteries, and veinssynonym: circulative, rotating

(1) a **circulatory** disease, (2) cause **circulatory** failure shock

The **circulatory** system of the animal is also responsible for heat transportation.

#### manifestation

 a visible or tangible form of something, especially a particular sign of a disease or condition

synonym: expression, embodiment, presentation

(1) **manifestation** of a deeper problem, (2) **manifestation** of psychological stress

The **manifestation** of his anxiety was evident in his shaking hands.

#### mundane

adj. very ordinary and therefore lacking interest or excitement

synonym: ordinary, everyday, prosaic

(1) mundane affairs, (2) mundane objects

After returning from the war, he had a pretty mundane life.

#### socioeconomic

adj. relating to the social and economic factors that shape an individual, group, or community, particularly in terms of income, occupation, education, and social class

synonym: social, economic, financial

(1) **socioeconomic** status, (2) **socioeconomic** issues

The **socioeconomic** conditions of a country can significantly affect its political stability.

### exponent

n. a person who supports and promotes a particular theory, idea, or scheme; a numerical expression usually written as a superscript that indicates the number of times a given number or expression is to be multiplied by itself

synonym: advocate, representative, exponent

(1) **exponent** function, (2) the **exponent** of the free market The CEO is an **exponent** of innovation and encourages employees to think outside the box.

# sigmoid

adj. relating to or shaped like the letter "S"

synonym: curved, bent, twisted

(1) sigmoid curve, (2) sigmoid artery

The doctor examined the **sigmoid** colon to check for any abnormalities.

#### destine

v. to determine or set the course of something in advance, often in a way that seems predetermined or inevitable; to specify or choose someone or something for a particular fate or outcome

synonym: ordain, doom, predestine

(1) **destine** us to meet again, (2) be **destined** to become a great artist

Some people believe that we are all **destined** for greatness.

#### innovate

# bureaucracy

synonym: administration, government, system
