appendectomy

n. a surgical procedure to remove the appendix, typically performed in cases of appendicitis or other conditions

coronary

cardiologist

angioplasty

artery

synonym: stent placement, vascular intervention

stethoscope

crack

lung

strain

diuretic

fluid
