 used to indicate that some other unspecified items or things could be included besides those already mentioned; and so on

synonym: and so on, and the like, and others

(1) tools, hardware, **etcetera**, (2) meetings, appointments, and **etcetera**

The museum contains a variety of artifacts, from ancient pottery to medieval armor, **etcetera**.

typical

adj. having the usual characteristics or traits of a specific group of things

synonym: characteristic, usual, distinctive

(1) **typical** leader, (2) fairly **typical** symptoms

This artwork is **typical** of her work.

blame

- to think or say that someone or something did something wrong or is responsible for something bad synonym: condemn, rebuke, find fault with
- (1) **blame** circumstances for the failure, (2) **blame** the lack of knowledge

We **blamed** our impeded progress on lack of money.

responsible

adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

synonym: accountable, answerable, liable

(1) responsible action, (2) responsible for a customer service

She's a **responsible** pet owner who ensures her dog gets enough exercise and a healthy diet.

yank

to pull something or someone forcefully with a sudden movement

synonym: draw, jerk, tug

(1) yank out a tooth, (2) yank at a rope

He tried to **yank** the memories from his brain.

offend

- to cause someone to feel upset, angry, or annoyed synonym: insult, hurt, anger
- (1) offend his sensibilities, (2) offend a customer His rude comments **offended** many people at the party.

skeptical

adj. doubting that something is accurate or useful synonym: doubtful, distrustful, suspicious

surgery

perverse

necessarily

adv. in an essential manner; in such a way as could not be otherwise

privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and

powerful in a society

synonym: benefit, authorization, advantage

(1) a breach of **privilege**, (2) **privilege** of membership In the Middle Ages, the right to hunt in the wild was the **privilege** of royalty and nobility.

honest-to-goodness

adj. genuine; true in a real, authentic sense; not false or phony

obesity

n. the condition of being significantly overweight, typically defined as having a body mass index (BMI) of 30 or greater.

diabetes

- n. a medical condition in which the body cannot produce enough insulin to control the glucose levels in the blood

statin

 a type of drug used to lower cholesterol levels in the blood, typically by inhibiting an enzyme involved in cholesterol production

synonym: cholesterol-lowering drug

cholesterol

n. a type of fat that is found in the blood and cells of the body and that is important for many bodily functions but can also contribute to heart disease and stroke when levels are too high

High levels of **cholesterol** can increase the risk of heart disease.

hire
