ram

# archaeology

#### gent

#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

*synonym*: cause, factor, element

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

#### choke

 to prevent or obstruct the normal breathing or swallowing of someone or something

synonym: strangle, suffocate, clog

motorbike

ache

 a tall standing pole that supports one or more electric lamps
