liver

- a large organ in the body, involved in many metabolic processes, such as detoxification of the organism, and the synthesis of proteins

cadaver

 a dead body, especially one used for scientific study or medical research

synonym: corpse, body, remains

debate

parliament

 a lot of discussion and argument about something, often involving strong feelings of anger or disapproval

 to notice or understand the difference between two people or things

voluntary

condemn

dilemma
