### economy

# planet

# philosophy

- the study of general and fundamental questions, such as those about existence, reason, knowledge, values, mind

# physics

- n. the science of matter and energy and their interactions

# chemistry

- the branch of the natural sciences dealing with the composition of substances and their properties and reactions

# footprint

# complexity

 the state or quality of being complicated or intricate and difficult to understand

synonym: intricacy, sophistication, elaboration

# engine

 a machine that converts thermal energy to mechanical work; something that has an important role used to achieve a purpose

#### distant

# argue

# poverty

# stability

# argument

 a set of statements or reasons used to support or refute a proposition or theory; a verbal or physical fight or dispute

# fascinating

adj. extremely interesting

synonym: alluring, intriguing, captivating

#### suit

#### moth

- an insect with wings similar to a butterfly that travels at night and is attracted to light

# negotiate

#### solar

#### abundance

 a significant amount of something; the situation in which there is too much of something

synonym: plenty, affluence, plentitude

(1) an age of **abundance**, (2) an **abundance** of examples A healthy farm provides an **abundance** of food.

# digital

 adj. processing or storing information as a succession of 1 and 0 to show that a signal is present or missing;
 relating to the use of computer technology, especially the internet

synonym: numerical, computerized, cyber

(1) a **digital** watch, (2) **digital** electronic signature Sensors convert physical phenomena into **digital** signals.

#### download

 to transfer data or files from the Internet or computer network to a user's computer or device; (noun) the process of transferring data or information from a remote or central computer to a local computer or device *synonym*: load, save, transfer

I need to **download** the latest update for my computer's operating system.

#### delusion

 a false belief or impression that is firmly held despite evidence to the contrary

synonym: hallucination, illusion, fantasy

### decent

adj. satisfactory, acceptable, or good in a general sense

synonym: respectable, honorable, good

(1) yearn for the **decent** living, (2) a **decent** education He earned a **decent** salary at his job.

# gentle

adj. having or showing a kindly or tender nature; soft and mild

synonym: mild, delicate, soft

(1) in a **gentle** voice, (2) **gentle** downward slope Her **gentle** manner relaxed everyone there.

# hiccup

 an involuntary movement of the muscles of the diaphragm and chest that causes a sudden intake of breath with a sound similar to a "hiccup"

synonym: hiccough

(1) stop my hiccup, (2) the cause of hiccupsThe hiccups lasted for hours and were driving him crazy.

#### accelerate

v. to make something faster or earlier; to cause to develop or progress more quickly

synonym: speed up, quicken, rev

#### react

- v. to take action in response to something
- *synonym*: respond, reply, oppose

#### warn

- v. to make someone aware of potential danger or difficulty, particularly one that may occur in the future
- synonym: alert, caution, admonish
- (1) warn a reckless driver, (2) warned me of the plan I attempted to warn him, but he ignored me.

# urgency

- the quality of being very important and needing to be dealt with immediately
- synonym: importance, importunity, urging
- (1) **urgency** in the use of force, (2) matter of **urgency**She departed hurriedly because of some significant **urgency**in their affairs.

#### afford

- v. to have enough money or time to be able to buy or do something
- (1) **afford** to buy a new car, (2) **afford** a high travel cost He cannot **afford** a holiday.

#### emission

- n. the act of production or sending out gas, heat, light, etc.synonym: emanation, radiation, discharge
- (1) global **emissions** of greenhouse gases, (2) the **emission** of light

There are five distinct **emissions** at five unique wavelengths.

# despair

- the feeling that there is no hope and you cannot do anything to improve a difficult situation
- synonym: dismay, anguish, misery
- (1) despair at the future, (2) untold despair

His friend's death drove him to despair.

# grieve

v. to feel or show great sadness or sorrow, especially for someone who has died

synonym: mourn, lament, sorrow

(1) **grieve** for loss, (2) **grieve** at the sad news She **grieved** the loss of her parents.

#### denial

- n. a statement that something is not true or does not existsynonym: refusal, rejection, veto
- state of denial, (2) an absolute denial
   She gave us a categorical denial of the scandal.

# recognize

v. to acknowledge or realize something or someone; to identify, remember, or become aware of something that was previously known or encountered

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

(1) recognize talent, (2) recognize achievementIt's important to recognize your strengths and weaknesses.

#### crisis

 a time of great disagreement, confusion, or danger when problems must be resolved or critical decisions must be taken

*synonym*: concern, problem, emergency

(1) financial **crisis**, (2) **crisis** management The Chinese word for **crisis** comprises two characters, one for danger and the other for opportunity.

#### breakdown

- n. a failure or collapse of a system or organizationsynonym: collapse, failure, malfunction

# underway

*adj.* having started and currently in progress *synonym*: afoot, ongoing, in motion

### integrate

 to combine one thing with another so that they form a whole or work together; to accept equal participation for members of all races and ethnic groups

synonym: mix, merge, combine

#### individual

- n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a group synonym: person, being, self

# spiral

- a curve that coils around a central point and gets progressively farther away from it as it goes around
   synonym: coil, helix, twist

# inequality

 n. the unfairness of a society in which some people have more opportunity, money, etc. than others;
 (mathematics) relation between two values when they

# are different

synonym: imbalance, prejudice, unfairness

#### influence

n. the ability to affect someone's or something's character, growth, or behavior, or the effect itself

# process

#### ineffective

adj. not producing any significant or intended effect or result synonym: useless, feeble, fruitless

# democracy

 a form of government in which the people have the authority to deliberate and decide legislation, or to choose governing officials to do so

#### overload

#### uncertain

adj. not being sure of something; not being able to choose synonym: doubtful, skeptical, pending

#### carbon

- a chemical element that can be found in pure form as diamond or graphite, and it is also an essential part of coal and oil and is found in all plants and animals

#### **bubble**

### generate

v. to produce or create something; to make offspring by reproduction

*synonym*: create, yield, produce

# conflict

 a strong disagreement, argument, or a violent clash between two opposing groups or individuals

synonym: clash, discord, competition

# collapse

v. to fall down or give way suddenly, often after breaking apart

*synonym*: tumble, spill, bankruptcy

# government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

# agriculture

 the practice or science of cultivating the land or raising stock
