#### locust

- a type of grasshopper that can travel in large swarms and cause extensive damage to crops; can also refer to various other insects such as cicadas or katydids

The **locust** infestation destroyed the crops, causing widespread famine.

# pupa

- the intermediate stage in the development of an insect between the larva and the adult
- synonym: chrysalis, cocoon, pupae

The **pupa** of the moth was hidden deep inside the cocoon.

# delicacy

- n. something appealing, refined, or subtle in taste, texture, or appearance; a food item that is considered rare, costly, or requiring special preparation; sensitivity or tact in dealing with others or handling delicate situations
- synonym: delectable, daintiness, refinement
- (1) **delicacy** of flavor, (2) seafood **delicacy**

She enjoyed the **delicacy** of the French cuisine at the fancy

#### restaurant.

#### cochineal

 a scale insect that is used to produce a red dye called carmine; the dye itself

synonym: carmine dye, insect dye

(1) **cochineal** dye, (2) **cochineal** extract

The red dye in the fabric was derived from the **cochineal** insect.

#### cactus

 a plant that typically grows in dry regions and has spiny leaves, stems, and often vibrant flowers

*synonym*: desert plant, succulent, thornbush

The hiker got pricked by a **cactus** needle while walking.

#### canary

- a small, typically yellow songbird that is often kept as a pet or used to denote the presence of gas or other hazards in a mine
- (1) canary bird, (2) canary yellow

The **canary** in the coal mine was used as an early warning system for miners about dangerous gases.

#### confer

- v. to have a meeting or discussion to come to a decision or agreement or exchange ideas; to bestow something
- synonym: consult, meet, discuss

(1) **confer** degree, (2) **confer** honor

The leaders of the two countries met to **confer** on the issue.

#### devote

v. to commit or dedicate oneself or one's time, effort, or energy to a particular task or purpose

synonym: commit, dedicate, apply

(1) **devote** all of my energies, (2) **devote** my own life He **devoted** himself to studying the history of ancient civilizations.

#### medicinal

*adj.* of or relating to the treatment or cure of disease *synonym*: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal** The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

#### proliferate

- to grow or increase rapidly in number; to reproduce or spread rapidly, especially in an uncontrolled manner synonym: multiply, spread, propagate
- (1) proliferate cells, (2) proliferate weeds The number of COVID cases continued to proliferate in many countries worldwide.

#### swine

- a domestic pig, especially one bred for its meat synonym: pig, hog, porker
- (1) **swine** flu, (2) **swine** industry

The farmer raises **swine** on his farm for the market.

#### manure

organic matter, such as animal dung or decaying plant material, used as fertilizer to improve the fertility of soil; animal waste material used as fertilizer

*synonym*: fertilizer, dung, compost

(1) composted **manure**, (2) animal **manure** The farmers used cow **manure** to create compost for their crops.

#### ammonia

- a compound of nitrogen and hydrogen that forms a gas with a strong smell, used as cleaning substances, fertilizers, and explosives
- (1) **ammonia** water, (2) inhale **ammonia** fumes The advent of **ammonia** fertilizers markedly increased agricultural productivity.

# malign

to speak or write about someone or something in a harmful or critical way; (adjective) evil or harmful in nature or influence

The article **maligned** the company's reputation with false accusations.

### grasshopper

 large jumping insect; used to symbolize restlessness or ephemerality

#### rainforest

- a forest rich in biodiversity that is generally found in tropical settings with heavy annual rainfall
