nongovernmental

adj. not belonging to or controlled by a government *synonym*: private, non-public, non-state

worsen

- v. to become or make something worse synonym: languish, degenerate, degrade
- (1) **worsen** a relation, (2) **worsen** the food problem Unilateral import bans have **worsened** that country's terms of trade.

aft

- adj. (the opposite of "forward") located at or towards the rear or back of a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle
- (1) aft cabin, (2) aft view

The **aft** section of the ship suffered significant damage after the collision with the reef.

worthless

adj. having no value or usefulness; not worth consideringsynonym: valueless, useless, pointless

The product was found to be **worthless** as it failed to meet the customer's expectations.

arouse

flashback

regress

 to move or develop backward; to return to an earlier or less advanced state or condition; to decline or deteriorate

synonym: retrovert, deteriorate, decline

repress

 to restrain or control by force; to suppress feelings or memories

synonym: suppress, control, curb
