cedar

 a type of fragrant, evergreen tree that is known for its reddish-brown wood and its use in furniture, building materials, and as an ornamental plant

synonym: juniper, redwood, pine

(1) cedar wood, (2) cedar bark

Tall **cedar** trees surrounded the cabin in the woods.

fir

 a type of tall evergreen tree that is native to the northern hemisphere, with needle-like leaves and cones that stand upright on the branches

synonym: pine, spruce, cedar

(1) fir branch, (2) fir forest

The smell of fresh **fir** trees filled the air at the Christmas tree farm.

quantify

- v. to express or measure something in numerical terms synonym: measure, express, determine
- (1) **quantify** the results, (2) **quantify** blood flow He tried to **quantify** the amount of product that was needed to complete the job.

vine

- a climbing plant that produces grapes; any plant with a growth habit of trailing or climbing stems
- (1) a green vine, (2) vine of ore

A **vine** remains productive throughout the year.

confine

- v. to restrict the movement of someone or something synonym: restrict, limit, contain
- (1) **confine** themselves solely, (2) **confine** the scope of use The animal was **confined** in a small cage.

incarcerate

v. to put or keep somebody in prison or in a place from which they cannot escape

synonym: confine, detain, imprison

(1) **incarcerate** the murderer, (2) **incarcerate** her for life He was **incarcerated** for the duration of the war.

rehabilitate

v. to restore to good health or physical condition; to help someone return to a normal life, especially after a period of illness, addiction, or imprisonment

synonym: reform, restore, renovate

(1) **rehabilitate** prisoners, (2) **rehabilitate** wildlife

The organization works to **rehabilitate** drug addicts and help them rebuild their lives.

incarceration

- *n.* the state of being confined in prison or jail *synonym*: confinement, imprisonment, detention
- (1) mass **incarceration**, (2) **incarceration** rates

 The judge sentenced him to five years of **incarceration** for embezzlement.

institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

inmate

relic

segregate

synonym: isolate, separate, divide

supermax

infraction

immobile

bleak
