#### probabilistic

#### asteroid

Scientists are studying the composition and origins of the **asteroid** belt to understand the early solar system better.

### pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

### sketchy

 adj. lacking in detail or completeness; vague, uncertain, or unreliable; suspicious or questionable

#### wildfire

 a large, uncontrolled fire that spreads quickly through a natural area such as a forest, grassland, or mountain slope

The **wildfire** destroyed hundreds of homes and forced thousands of people to evacuate.

### reappear

Cancer has **reappeared** at the same site.

### converge

 to move or draw together at a specific location; (of lines) to move towards the same point where they join or meet synonym: congregate, assemble, concentrate

### pneumonia

- n. an infection or inflammation of the lungs, typically caused by bacteria, viruses, or other microorganisms
- synonym: lung infection, bronchitis
- bacterial pneumonia, (2) viral pneumonia
   She was hospitalized with a severe case of pneumonia.

### whisper

scar

v. to speak very quietly to somebody using the breath rather than the voice so that only those close to you can hear you

synonym: murmur, rumor, mutter

- (1) answer in a **whisper**, (2) the **whisper** of the leaves He took me aside and **whispered** in my ear.
- a mark that remains on the skin after a wound has healed

*synonym*: blemish, imperfection, blotch

(1) burn scar, (2) carry a scar

Even after the wound has healed, a scar remains.

#### inoculate

v. to introduce a vaccine into the body to produce immunity to a specific disease

*synonym*: vaccinate, immunize, protect

(1) **inoculate** against disease, (2) **inoculate** with a virus The doctor **inoculated** the child with a vaccine.

### smallpox

 a highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever, weakness, spots on the skin, and often death

synonym: variola

(1) **smallpox** epidemic, (2) **smallpox** vaccine An outbreak of **smallpox** occurred in the 1920s.

### polio

 an acute infectious disease caused by a virus that attacks nerve cells in the spinal cord and brain, leading to paralysis, muscle weakness, and potentially lifelong disability

synonym: poliomyelitis, infantile paralysis

The **polio** vaccine development is regarded as one of the greatest medical achievements of the 20th century.

### pathogen

a bacterium, virus, or other microorganism that causes disease

#### immunization

the process of making a person or animal immune to a specific disease by administering a vaccine or other preventative measure

synonym: vaccination, shot, inoculation

- an enemy or opponent; someone or something that is opposed to or in conflict with another

*synonym*: enemy, adversary, opponent

#### narrator

foe

- a person who tells a story, especially in a book or film synonym: teller, storyteller
- (1) first-person **narrator**, (2) the **narrator** of the TV program The narrator makes use of the local dialect.

#### neutralize

- to counteract or cancel the effects of something; to make something neutral or harmless synonym: counteract, invalidate, cancel out
- (1) **neutralize** a toxin, (2) **neutralize** an argument We need to **neutralize** the acidity of this soil before we can grow any crops.

#### invade

to enter aggressively into another's territory by military force for conquest and occupation

synonym: intrude, raid, overrun

(1) **invade** other tissues, (2) **invade** his privacy I have no intention to **invade** your privacy.

aft

- adj. (the opposite of "forward") located at or towards the rear or back of a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle
- (1) aft cabin, (2) aft view

The **aft** section of the ship suffered significant damage after the collision with the reef.

#### penetrate

v. to pass into or through something, often by overcoming resistance

synonym: pierce, stab, go through

- (1) **penetrate** a cell, (2) **penetrate** quickly into the skin Western ideology slowly **penetrates** through the eastern countries.
- a slimy liquid produced inside the nose and other body parts for lubrication, protection, etc.

synonym: secretion, slime, saliva

When the body temperature drops, **mucus** secretion fails.

#### infect

mucus

to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

*synonym*: pollute, contaminate, affect

Children often infect parents with this head cold.

#### replicate

v. to make an exact copy of something; to repeat a process or experiment to confirm the results

synonym: duplicate, imitate, reproduce

(1) replicate the cell, (2) replicate data

The experiment was **replicated** several times to ensure accuracy.

#### frontline

adj. in the most critical or dangerous position; in the military line or part of an army closest to the enemy

synonym: battlefront, cutting edge

(1) **frontline** health workers, (2) at the **frontline** of the war Within days, the new aircraft was in **frontline** service.

#### troop

*n.* a group of soldiers, especially a large one; a group of people, animals, or things considered as a unit.

synonym: group, unit, band

(1) the members of a military **troop**, (2) a **troop** of deer The **troop** of soldiers marched through the city in a parade.

#### dendrite

 a branched, tree-like structure that extends from a neuron (= nerve cell) and receives signals from other neurons and sensory receptors

synonym: nerve cell, branch, projection

Damage to **dendrites** can result in communication problems between neurons and may contribute to certain neurological disorders.

### macrophage

 a large white blood cell that helps to engulf and destroy foreign objects or materials in the body, such as bacteria or cancer cells

### protuberance

### cripple

 to cause severe damage or injury that greatly impairs someone's ability to function or move; to weaken or undermine

### imaginable
