#### acumen

#### mashup

a combination or fusion of different elements, often referring to the blending or remixing of different songs, video clips, or other media forms

synonym: mixture, blend, combination

#### innovate

#### astonishing

### reorganize

to change to a more sufficient or suitable form of organization

*synonym*: rearrange, reconstruct, reshuffle

#### stamina
