# telegraph

- a method of long-distance transmission of messages by electrical or radio signals
- answer by telegraph, (2) telegraph wires
   telegraph service was interrupted for a while.

## asymmetric

 adj. lacking symmetry or balance; not corresponding in size, shape, or degree; characterized by an uneven or unequal distribution or arrangement

synonym: uneven, lopsided, unbalanced

(1) **asymmetric** warfare, (2) **asymmetric** information The **asymmetric** design of the building made it stand out in the city skyline.

### peacock

n. a large, colorful, and majestic bird of the pheasant family
(1) as proud as a peacock, (2) male peacock

The vibrant feathers of the **peacock** made it stand out in the garden.

#### twit

a silly or foolish person; someone regarded as annoying or irritating

synonym: fool, idiot, imbecile

(1) celebrity twit, (2) neighborhood twit

Please ignore that **twit** on social media; their opinions are irrelevant.

# quake

- v. to shake or vibrate violently and for a short time synonym: shake, trembler, tremor
- (1) quake in his boots, (2) quake with cold

The earth began to **quake**, and he knew he had to leave the building immediately.

### ripple

 a small wave on the surface of a liquid, typically caused by an object falling into it or a slight wind

*synonym*: wave, undulation, fluctuation

(1) a **ripple** of laughter, (2) **ripple** in the water Many businesses felt the **ripple** effect of the economy's decline.

#### wildfire

 a large, uncontrolled fire that spreads quickly through a natural area such as a forest, grassland, or mountain slope

synonym: blaze, bonfire, flame

(1) **wildfire** spread, (2) arson-caused **wildfire**The **wildfire** destroyed hundreds of homes and forced thousands of people to evacuate.

#### collate

v. to collect, arrange, and assemble information or material in a specified order or sequence

synonym: compare, correlate, match

(1) collate data, (2) collate information

I need to **collate** these documents in the correct order before stapling them together.

#### kitten

n. a young cat

synonym: catling, kitling, puss

(1) kitten formula, (2) newborn kitten

The **kitten's** fur was so fluffy that it looked like it was always moving.

#### treadmill

n. a piece of exercise equipment consisting of a moving belt on which the user walks, jogs, or runs in place; a monotonous, repetitive task or activity that feels like it is going nowhere, much like a person walking on a treadmill

synonym: exercise machine, routine

(1) treadmill workout, (2) nonstop treadmill

I like to watch TV while running on the **treadmill** to pass the time.

#### bribe

 to try to make someone do something to gain one's favors or influence by giving a gift of money or other

#### inducements

synonym: graft, corrupt

#### prostrate

 adj. lying flat, face down, or completely stretched out on the ground; physically or emotionally incapacitated or overcome; completely submissive or humble

*synonym*: lying, prone, flat

(1) **prostrate** position, (2) **prostrate** form of prayer After a long day of work, he lay **prostrate** on the couch, completely exhausted.

### placate

v. to make someone less angry or hostile; to calm or soothe someone upset or agitated

synonym: appease, pacify, soothe

The manager tried to **placate** the angry customer by offering a refund.

#### radicalize

 to cause or become more radical in one's beliefs or actions; to adopt or promote more extreme or uncompromising ideas or practices

synonym: transform, alter

(1) **radicalize** religious groups, (2) **radicalize** ideology The extremist group aims to **radicalize** young people through its propaganda.

#### sparse

adj. only in small quantities or numbers and often spread over a wide area

synonym: scarce, exiguous, infrequent

#### spigot

 a valve or faucet used to control the flow of liquid from a container or pipe

synonym:

faucet, tap, valve

#### censor

a person or institution responsible for examining books, movies, and other forms of media to determine if they are harmful or offensive and should be banned or altered; an official in charge of banning or suppressing information

The newspaper editor decided to **censor** the controversial headline to avoid backlash.

# ubiquitous

# freaky

adj. strange or unusual in a way that is frightening or unsettling

synonym: weird, strange, unusual

(1) freaky accident, (2) freaky-deaky
