#### exorcise

synonym: purge, expel, banish

(1) **exorcise** demons, (2) **exorcise** negative energy

The priest performed a ritual to **exorcise** the evil spirits from the haunted house.

### medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of diseasesynonym: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

### convulsion

 a violent, involuntary contraction or shaking of the muscles, especially those in the limbs or face; a sudden, intense, and often violent disturbance or upheaval

#### botanical

#### Renaissance

### camphor

#### kite

### relapse

### antidepressant

### electroencephalography

synonym: brain wave test, EEG, neural scan

(1) electroencephalography test, (2) abnormal electroencephalography

She is an **electroencephalography** technician skilled in performing EEG tests on patients.

### twitch

### dreadful

*adj.* very bad, unpleasant, or causing fear *synonym*: terrible, horrible, awful

(1) dreadful accident, (2) dreadful news

The conditions of the prison were **dreadful** and inhumane.

### hostility

- n. aggressive or unfriendly feelings or behaviorsynonym: antagonism, antipathy, estrangement
- (1) an act of hostility, (2) bitter hostilityHer unconcealed hostility made us unpleasant.

#### bovine

 adj. relating to or resembling cows or cattle; pertaining to the characteristics or behavior of bovines

synonym: cattle-like, bovid, cow-like

#### stercus

### jaundiced
